**Adultry**

Voluntary sexual intercourse between a married person and a partner other than the lawful spouse.

**Fornication**

Sexual intercourse between partners who are not married to each other.

**Uncleanness**

1) The condition or state of being dirty  
2) Impure condition

**Lasciviousness**

1) Given to or expressing lust; lecherous.  
2) Exciting sexual desires; salacious.

**Idolatry**

1) Worship of idols.  
2) Blind or excessive devotion to something.

**Witchcraft**

1) Magic; sorcery.  
2) Wicca.  
3) A magical or irresistible influence, attraction, or charm.

**Hatred**

Intense animosity or hostility.

**Variance**

1a) The act of varying.  
b) The state or quality of being variant or variable; a variation.  
c) A difference between what is expected and what actually occurs.  
2) The state or fact of differing or of being in conflict. See Synonyms at discord.

**Emulations**

1) Effort or ambition to equal or surpass another.  
2) Imitation of another.

**Wrath**

Forceful, often vindictive anger

**Strife**

1) Heated, often violent dissension; bitter conflict. See Synonyms at discord.  
2) A struggle, fight, or quarrel.  
3) Contention or competition between rivals.

**Sedition**

1) Conduct or language inciting rebellion against the authority of a state.  
2) Insurrection; rebellion.

**Heresy**

1) An opinion or a doctrine at variance with established religious beliefs, especially dissension from or denial of Roman Catholic dogma by a professed believer or baptized church member.

2) Adherence to such dissenting opinion or doctrine.

**Envyings**

1) A feeling of discontent and resentment aroused by and in conjunction with desire for the possessions or qualities of another.

2) The object of such feeling

**Murders**

The unlawful killing of one human by another, especially with premeditated malice.

**Drunkenness**

1) Delirious with or as if with strong drink; intoxicated.  
2) Habitually drunk.

**Revellings**

To take great pleasure or delight:

To engage in uproarious festivities; make merry.
